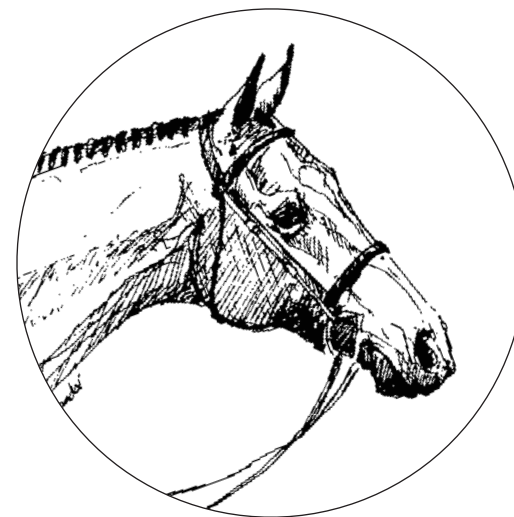

The Lakeville Pony Club is a member of the New York/Upper Connecticut Region, United States Pony Club, and the third oldest club in the country. In 1956 the club began at the barn of Lucy Drummond in Salisbury. The following year the club initiated the first Lakeville Open Horse Show.

Today our club's home base is at Riga Meadow Equestrian Center, LLC in Salisbury. Our current membership includes children not only from the towns of the Northwest Corner, but also New York and Massachusetts. We have a broad range of ages and abilities. Horse ownership is not a pre-requisite to membership. Some of our members own or lease their own horse, however, most of our members do not have their own horse. Thanks to The Benefactor Fund (see page 10) we now have a horse for the children to share.

HUNT SEAT EQUITATION DIVISION

Maiden Equitation Section: Open to all Junior riders who have never won a blue ribbon in any Equitation Class, other than Lead Line and Short Stirrup. Test 1

1. Maiden Equitation on the Flat

2. Maiden Equitation Over Fences (Fences 2'-2' 6")

Novice Equitation Section: Open to all Junior riders who have not won 3 blue ribbons in any Equitation Classes, other than Lead Line and Short Stirrup. Tests 1-7

3. Novice Equitation on the Flat

4. Novice Equitation over Fences (Fences 2' 6"-2' 9")

Open Equitation Section: Open to all Junior riders. Tests 1-18

5. Open Equitation on the Flat

6. Open Equitation Over Fences (Fences 2' 9"- 3')

Adult Equitation Section: Open to all riders who have reached their 19th birthday on or before January 1, 2011. Tests 1-7

7. Adult Equitation on the Flat

8. Adult Equitation Over Fences (Fences not to exceed 2' 9")

9. Equitation Championship: Open to 1st and 2nd place winners in classes 1-8 only. Hack off for Championship and Reserve- Tests 1-7

SHORT STIRRUP DIVISION

*Open to riders who have not reached their
14th birthday by January 1, 2011*

Riders entering this division may not ride in any other classes except Pony Pleasure Class (Class 53) and/or Pleasure Horse (Class 52), and/or Road Hack (Class 54) *Not quite ready for this division?* Consider our Walk/Trot Division.

10. Short Stirrup Walk/Trot

11. Short Stirrup Walk/Trot/Canter

12. Short Stirrup Over Crossrails

13. Short Stirrup Championship- Awarded on points from classes 10-12.

WALK TROT DIVISION

Open to riders who are 12 years old and under. Riders entering in this division may not ride in any other classes in the show.

14. Walk/Trot

15. Walk/Trot Pleasure

16. Walk/Trot Poles—Rider should show jumping position over poles.

17. Walk/Trot Championship—Awarded on points from Classes 14-16

18. Children's Lead Line—Riders in this class may not enter any other class in the show. Entry Fee: \$5.00

LONG STIRRUP DIVISION

Open only to beginning adult riders who have never won a championship before this horse show or have never competed over fences taller than 2' in any equestrian sport (even as a junior!). Riders entering this division may not ride in any other classes except those in the Pleasure Division. They may not enter the Adult classes of the Hunt Seat Equitation Division.

19. Long Stirrup Walk/Trot

20. Long Stirrup Walk/Trot/Canter

21. Long Stirrup Over Crossrails

22. Long Stirrup Championship—Awarded on points from classes 19—21

GREEN WORKING HUNTER DIVISION

Open to horses in their 1st or 2nd year of showing over fences. Fences not to exceed 2' 9". To be conducted over our outside hunter course.

23. Green Working Hunter Over Fences

24. \$225 Green Working Hunter Stake—Entry Fee \$20 Stake: 1st: \$100 2nd: \$75 3rd: \$50. *(Riders must enter classes 23 & 25 to be eligible for this class.)*

25. Green Working Hunter Under Saddle—Martingales prohibited

26. Green Working Hunter Championship—Please note the rules for championships awarded on points (from Classes 23, 24, 25).

OPEN WORKING HUNTER DIVISION

Fences to exceed 3'. To be conducted on our outside hunter course.

- 27. **Open Working Hunter Over Fences**
- 28. **\$225 Open Working Hunter Stake**—Entry Fee \$20 Stake: 1st \$100 2nd \$75 3rd \$50. (*Riders must enter classes 27 & 29 to be eligible for this class.*)
- 29. **Open Working Hunter Under Saddle**—Martingales prohibited
- 30. **Open Working Hunter Championship**—Please note the rules for championships awarded on points. (From classes 27, 28 and 29)

JUMPER DIVISION

- 31. **Junior Jumping**— Table II, Section II Fences not to exceed 3'. Open to junior riders. Will not be included in championship points.
- 32. **Low Jumpers**—To be conducted according to Table II, Section II. Fences not to exceed 3' 3", spread not to exceed 3' 3".
- 33. **Open Jumper**—To be conducted according to Table II, Section II. Fences not to exceed 3' 6", spread not to exceed 3' 6".
- 34. **\$225 Open Jumper Stake**— Horse and Rider must enter at least one other class in this division. To be conducted according to Table II. Fences not to exceed 3' 9", spreads not to exceed 3' 9". Entry Fee \$20. Stake: 1st \$100; 2nd \$75; 3rd \$50. (*Riders must enter one other class in this division (31-33) to be eligible for this class*)
- 35. **Open Jumper Championship**—Please note the rules for championships awarded on points. (From classes 32, 33, 34)

PONY HUNTER DIVISION

Open to all Junior riders. Fences not to exceed 2' 6", Small ponies jump 2' 0". Medium and large ponies jump 2' 6".

- 36. **Pony Hunter Over Fences**
- 37. **\$225 Pony Hunter Stake**—Entry Fee \$20. Stake: 1st \$100; 2nd \$75; 3rd \$50 (*Riders must enter classes 36 & 38 to be eligible for this class*)
- 38. **Pony Hunter Under Saddle**—Martingales prohibited.
- 39. **Pony Hunter Championship**—Please note the rules for championships awarded on points (*from Classes 36, 37, 38*).

CHILDREN'S HUNTER DIVISION

Open to all junior riders. Horses and ponies are eligible. Fences not to exceed 2' 6". To be conducted on our outside hunter course. Consider a practice run over the hunter course in our unjudged hunter warm up class. Details on entry form.

- 40. **Children's Hunter Over Fences**
- 41. **\$225 Children's Hunter Stake**— Entry Fee \$20 Stake: 1st \$100; 2nd \$75; 3rd \$75. (*Riders must enter classes 40 & 42 to be eligible for this class.*)
- 42. **Children's Hunter Under Saddle**—Martingales prohibited
- 43. **Children's Hunter Championship**—Please note the rules for championships awarded on points. (From classes 40, 41, & 42)

EVERGREEN DIVISION

Open to the beginning horse/rider to jump 2' over our outside course. Trotting in corners will not be penalized. No combinations. This class is for young horses, beginning riders, just starting out. Not to be used for practice.

- 44. **Evergreen Hunter Over Fences**
- 45. **\$225 Evergreen Hunter Stake**—*Entry Fee \$20 Stake: 1st \$100; 2nd \$75; 3rd \$50. (Riders must enter classes 44 & 46 to be eligible for this class.)*
- 46. **Evergreen Under Saddle**—Martingales prohibited
- 47. **Evergreen Championship**—Please note the rules for championships awarded on points. (From classes 44, 45, & 46)

ADULT HUNTER DIVISION

Open to all amateur adults. Fences not to exceed 2'6".

- 48. **Adult Hunter Over Fences**
- 49. **\$225 Adult Hunter Stake**—Entry Fee \$20 Stake: 1st \$100; 2nd \$75; 3rd \$50 (*Riders must enter classes 48 & 50 to be eligible for this class.*)
- 50. **Adult Hunter Under Saddle**—Martingales prohibited
- 51. **Adult Hunter Championship**—Please note the rules for championships awarded on points. (From classes 48, 49, & 50)

PLEASURE DIVISION

No martingales permitted in classes 52-56.

- 52. Pleasure Horse**—To be ridden at a reasonably loose rein on command. May be asked to back. Extended gaits may be requested. Judged on manners, performance, quality, and suitability.
- 53. Pleasure Pony**—(Judged like class 52)
- 54. Open Road Hack (Horse and Pony)**—May be asked to back. If hand gallop is requested no more than 8 will hand gallop at one time. Judged on performance, substance, and manners.
- 55. Handy Hunter**—Open to horses and ponies. May be asked to jump two small fences (max 2' 6"). May be asked to hand gallop.
- 56. Pleasure Championship Class**—Hack off, open to the three horses and three ponies receiving the most total points in classes 52-55. Entry Fee \$5.00
- 57. Hunter Pairs Class**—Entry Fee \$10 per pair. Judged on the ability of the pair to present an orderly, smoothly synchronized picture of a hunter pair. May be offered the opportunity to jump (not required) at the judges discretion. Class to run on outside course.

Championships awarded on points are subject to the following rules: (1) To be eligible for champion or reserve the same horse and rider team must have shown and been judged in at least two classes in that division. (2) Points for every class in the division are awarded 5-3-2-1. In the event of a tie in points, the championship, (or reserve) will be awarded to the combination with the highest placement in that divisions over fences classes. (3) In the event that no horse and rider combination meets these qualifications, championship (or reserve) will not be awarded.

Headgear— *Show management requires all riders to wear ASTM/SEI headgear with harness properly fitted and secured.*

NO HORSE OR PONY ADMITTED WITHOUT NEGATIVE COGGINS AND PROOF OF RABIES CERTIFICATE.

Entries: Pre-paid entries are \$15.00 per class unless otherwise stated. Pre-paid entries for current U.S. Pony Club members are \$10.00 per class, unless otherwise stated, such as for stake classes. Identify the name of the club on entry form. Make checks payable to LAKEVILLE PONY CLUB. A refundable \$1.00 deposit will be required for each rider's number.

Entries and fees must be received by September 16th to qualify for the pre-entry rate. Post entries will gladly be accepted @ \$5 extra per class.

Directions:

From North: Take US Route 41 South from Rt. 23 in South Egremont, MA towards CT. At MA/CT border see sign saying Entering Salisbury, barn is 2.1 miles south from that sign on left.

From South: Take CT Route 41 North from Sharon, CT to the four corners at the Hotchkiss School. Continue straight on Route 41 through Lakeville, CT and Salisbury, CT. At the White Hart Inn in Salisbury bear left on Route 41 and the barn is approximately 2.8 miles from the Inn on the right.

From West: At traffic light in Millerton NY on NY Route 22 turn east on Route 44 heading towards Lakeville, CT and Salisbury, CT. At the White Hart Inn in Salisbury bear left on Route 41 and the barn is approximately 2.8 miles from the Inn on the right.

From East: Take US Rt. 44 West from Canaan, CT to Salisbury, Ct. At the White Hart Inn in Salisbury take a sharp right turn onto Route 41 and the barn is approximately 2.8 miles from the inn on the right.

ABOUT OUR JUDGES . . .

Karen Manning started riding at age nine in Anchorage, Alaska. After moving to West Nyack, NY she worked in her family's barn and at the age of 14 became the "Road Manager" for Coach House Stables in Rye, New York taking 25 horse to A rated show in the US and Canada. After being inspired by her uncle, Mark Jungherr and his many grand prix wins on his horse Just Plain Wilber, she began her teaching career at the Lake Placid horse show when she was 18 years old. After college she became the manager and trainer at Coach House Stables.

In 1991 Karen became the coach of the Intercollegiate Riding Team at Mount Holyoke College where she took the team to a first place regional finish. Karen is now the principal at Lee H. Kellogg School in Falls Village, CT.

Pat Barton is a freelance instructor and local horse show judge. She was the Director of the Riding Center at Dana Hall School in Wellesley MA from 1973-1978 and the owner/Manager/Instructor of Stepping Out Farm in Littleton, MA from 1978-1989.
