CLASS DESCRIPTIONS RING ONE: SAND RING

Birthday as of January 1 of this year

LEADLINE (10): W/T. Riders may not enter any other classes.

WALK-TROT (7, 8, 9): Open to riders who are 12 years and under. Championship based on points from classes 7, 8 and 9.

SHORT STIRRUP (1, 2, 3): Open to riders 13 years and under. Riders may not ride in any other classes with exception of Pleasure Horse or Pleasure Pony. Championship based on points from classes 1, 2 and 3.

LONG STIRRUP (4, 5, 6): Open to junior riders 14 years and older and adults who have never competed over fences above 2'. Riders may not ride in any other classes with exception of Pleasure Horse/Pony. Championship based on points from classes 4, 5, and 6.

WARM-UP ROUNDS (II, 16): Class II 2', Class 16 2'3" - 2'6". Unjudged round (Entry fee \$10).

MAIDEN EQUITATION (13, 14, 15): Over fences 2'. Open to all junior riders who have never won a blue ribbon in equitation, other than Leadline and Short/Long Stirrup. Championship based on points from classes 13, 14 and 15.

CHILD /ADULT EQUITATION (18, 19, 20): Over fences 2'3'' - 2'6''. Open to all junior and adult riders. Championship based on pointes from classes 18, 19 and 20.

PUDDLE JUMPERS (12): 2' jumper class (Table II, Section II).

LOW JUMPERS (17): 2'3" – 2'6" jumper class (Table II, Section II).

OPEN JUMPER (21, 22): Class 21 2'9" max., Class 22 3'0" max. (Table II, Section II). Riders may not ride in Puddle (12) or Low Jumper (17) classes. Warm-up rounds (11, 16) allowed.

PLEASURE HORSE & PLEASURE PONY (23, 24): To be ridden at reasonably loose rein on command. May be asked to back and perform extended gates. Judged on manners, performance, quality and suitability.

OPEN ROAD HACK (25): Open to horses and ponies. May be asked to back. If hand gallop is requested, no more than 8 will hand gallop at one time. Judged on performance, substance, and manners. Pleasure championship based on points from classes 23, 24 and 25.

RING TWO: OUTSIDE GRASS COURSE

EVERGREEN HUNTER (26, 27, 28): Fences not to exceed 2'. Open to the beginner horse/rider to jump 2' over outside course. Trotting on corners will not be penalized. For young horses or beginning riders; not to be used for practice. Stake: 1st: \$100, 2nd: \$75, 3rd: \$50 (Riders must enter classes 26 and 28 to be eligible for Stake Class.) Martingales prohibited in U/S. Championship based on points from classes 26, 27 and 28.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER/PONY HUNTER (29, 30, 31): Open to all junior riders on horse or pony. Small ponies jump 2'. Med/large ponies and horses jump 2'6" max. Stake: Ist: \$100, 2nd: \$75, 3rd: \$50 (Riders must enter classes 29 and 31 to be eligible for Stake Class.) Martingales prohibited in U/S. Championship based on points from classes 29, 30 and 31.

If 6 or more of each (horses and ponies) are entered in this class, it may be split at judge's discretion.

HANDY HUNTER (32): Open to horses and ponies. May be asked to jump two small fences not to exceed 2'6". May be asked to hand gallop.

ADULT HUNTER (33, 34, 35): Fences not to exceed 2'6". Open to all adults (including professionals schooling a beginning horse that has not competed Over 2'6"). Stake: Ist: \$100, 2nd: \$75, 3rd: \$50 (Riders must enter classes 33 and 35 to be eligible for Stake Class.) Martingales prohibited in U/S. Championship based on points from classes 33, 34 and 35.

OPEN WORKING HUNTER (36, 37, 38): Fences not to exceed 2'9". Stake: Ist: \$100, 2nd: \$75, 3rd: \$50 (Riders must enter classes 36 and 38 to be eligible for Stake Class.) Martingales prohibited in U/S. Championship based on points from classes 36, 37 and 38.

Entry fees for all stakes classes (prepaid included) are \$25 per stake class. Make checks payable to *LAKEVILLE PONY CLUB*. A refundable \$1 deposit will be required for each rider's number. HEADGEAR: Show management requires all riders to wear ASTM/SEI approved headgear with harness properly fitted and secured.

Management reserves the right to combine, change, or cancel classes. *Stakes classes with fewer than 6 entries will not pay out prize money.*

All classes offer six ribbons. Championships awarded on points are subject to the following rules: (I) To be eligible for champion or reserve, the same horse and rider team must have shown and been judged in at least two classes in that division. (2) Points for every class in the division are awarded 5-3-2-I. In the event of a tie in points, the championship (or reserve) will be awarded to the combination with the highest placement in that division's Over fences classes (or in Open Road Hack for Pleasure division). (3) In the event that no horse and rider combination meets these qualifications, championship (or reserve) will not be awarded.
